YOU SAID, WE DID

A range of engagement events were held in July during Alcohol Awareness, and Anti-Social Behaviour Week, including alcohol tagging with Police Cadets and pop-up engagement events across Great Yarmouth and Gorleston with other organisations such as Great Yarmouth Borough Council, Norfolk's Fire and Rescue Service, and the Community Alcohol Partnership.

Foot patrols have taken place in the rural Flegg villages, with visits conducted to local businesses and schools, Parish, Burgh and County Councillors', Hemsby Lifeboat, a local children's home, housing providers, and GP surgeries.

Visits were made to schools in Caister including the Infant and Junior school, and Academy. Our Special Constabulary officers attended the Caister Carnival at the start of the summer, and we went along to a recent Caister Parish Council's meeting. We've also supported accessible events at The Rabbit Hutch, a café and community hub.

Our officers have been working with Yarmouth Town Centre Wardens and Market Gates Security during the opening phases of the marketplace, conducting pop-up engagement events in the area during the busiest summer months in particular.

Targeted hotspot patrols have taken place in South Yarmouth, including in Victoria Road, King Street, Princes Road, the Seafront and St George's Park, in a bid to address anti-social behaviour, including street drinking.
