North & South Yarmouth news

A 35-year-old serial house burglar who targeted 17 homes across Great Yarmouth between December 2022 and March 2023 has been jailed for five years.

Four arrests were made as part of a national campaign targeting knife crime, which saw police searching for discarded knives in public areas of Great Yarmouth and other areas of the county.

A 31-year-old man was jailed for four years for robbery and attempted robbery after committing six offences, including two on St Nicholas Road, Great Yarmouth.

Our officers have been conducting foot patrols and engaging with local community groups and schools, such as visits to the Masjid At-Tauwheed Mosque on Northgate Street.

We held another week of 'Alcohol Awareness' in April speaking to staff in off-licences, children, parents, and members of the public about the dangers of alcohol and young people.

We held a successful public appeal to try to reunite victims with a large number of bikes and tools that were recovered after two men were arrested on suspicion of handling stolen goods.

We continue to have a presence at car and motorcycle meets on the seafront to ensure the Public Spaces Protection Order in place in the area is upheld, reducing antisocial behaviour.




